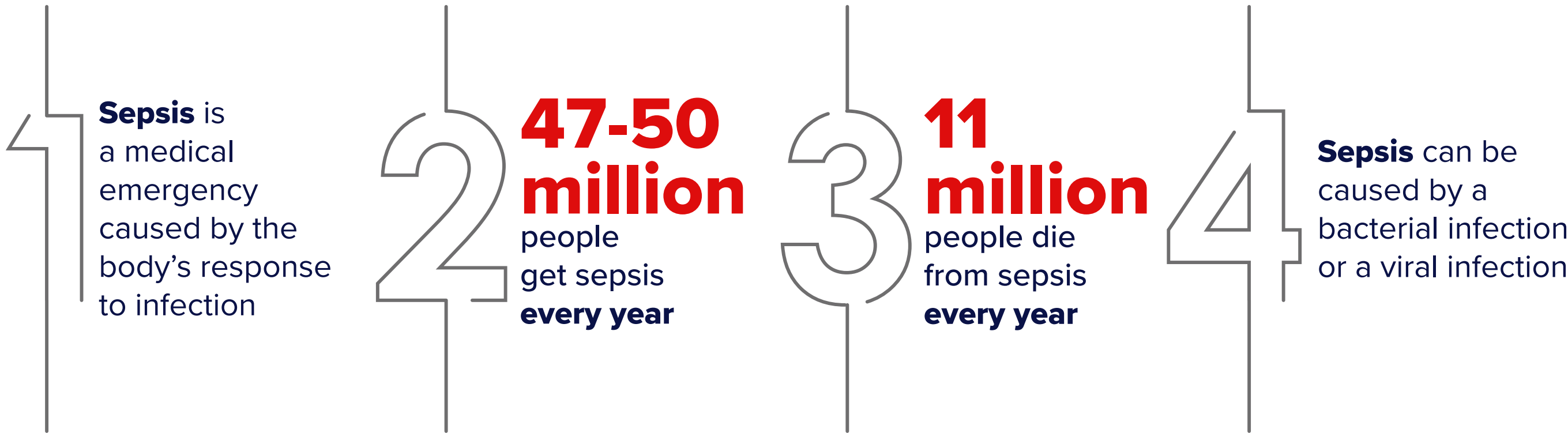


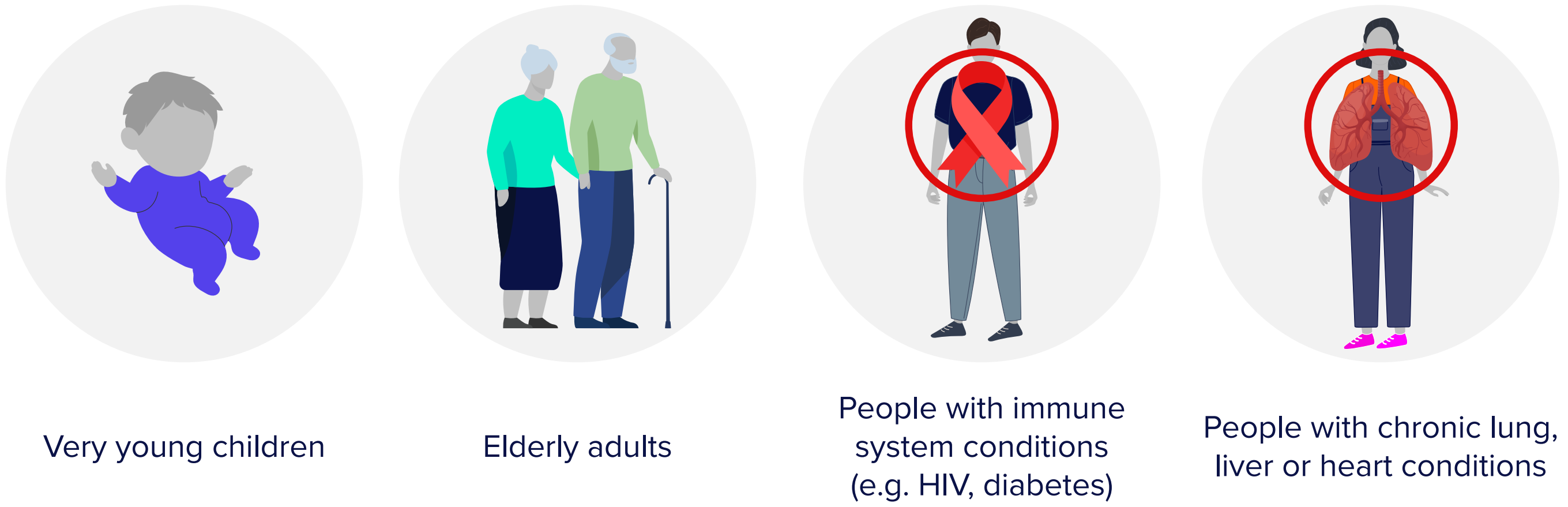
What is Sepsis?



Who is at Risk of Getting Sepsis?

Anyone can get an infection, and almost any infection can lead to sepsis.

The risk of fatal sepsis is higher for people with compromised immune systems, including:

Possible symptoms of sepsis:

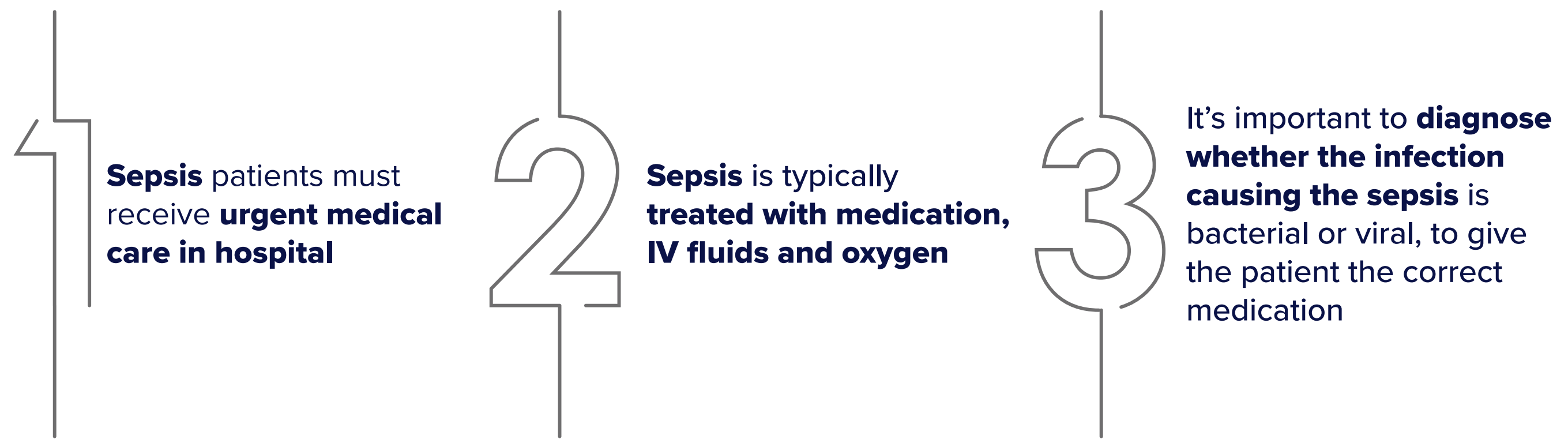
